





Applying Spiritual Principles To Unity

Unity is the foundation of all our Traditions and we need to practice it for the good of our personal recovery as well as the Fellowship as a whole. But how does one go about doing this! By applying some spiritual principles, such as surrender, acceptance, commitment, selflessness, love and anonymity, one can increase unity and allow for both personal growth and the growth of the Fellowship.

Surrender to the program of NA is about learning to live by spiritual principles in our daily lives. We do this by working the Steps and Traditions with our sponsors and hearing experience, strength and hope shared in the rooms. It is also about putting our personal preferences aside for the good of the group and working together to support our home group so that the meeting can continue.

Acceptance of our addiction is one of the first things we must do upon coming into the rooms. Another part of acceptance is allowing other addicts to be where they are at and to grow spiritually in their own time.

Commitment is showing up for one more meeting even when we don't feel like it. It is also the addicts who make sure the doors are open: the coffee makers and the ones who set up chairs, and the secretaries and the greeters.

Selflessness is displayed in the rooms by the way we give out phone numbers to newcomers, share our experience, strength and hope, serve on sub-committees, and support our home groups. It is also shown to us in our relationships with our sponsors when they give of their time and experience.

Love is the atmosphere that we strive for in our meetings, that open acceptance of each addict regardless of circumstance. This atmosphere is vital for a newcomer and it cannot be maintained if we are fighting among ourselves or dividing into cliques or gossiping.

Anonymity is truly simple. It means that any addict regardless of "age, race, sexual identity, creed, religion, or lack of religion" is a part of NA as a whole and that is our unity.

By practicing these spiritual principles, we have a foundation of unity for our common welfare: the rooms of Narcotics Anonymous with the message of recovery available to us all.

N.A. Readers Write

The Newcomer Asks; "What's a Sponsor and how do I get one?"

For me, I've asked several people to be my sponsor. In the various programs I'm in, I've had as many as 12 sponsors with as many as 3 at one time. Nothing like an addict to over do it, huh? In NA, I've had only one sponsor for over a year now. Along the way to working with this sponsor I've asked the above question numerous times and had quite a bit of trouble finding the answer. I've had ones who told me what to do, how and why to do it, and even one that said only what I wanted to hear. Sometimes it seemed like it was working. My current sponsor approached it differently. He listened, shared his own experience, hope and strength.

When I'm in a place he hasn't been, he doesn't B.S. me, or try to tell me how to get out of it. He asks me how I feel, what I can do about it, and how I can apply what I've leaned in the program that could help. I know I've got a long way to go, but with him I can look back on the progress I've made. He's been there when I was angry (even at him), sad and when I needed help looking at my behavior. He's helped me to work the steps and fine tune my personal recovery program.

I can only share what I have learned because a sponsor can be different things to different people. I had to try out many sponsors before finding one that works with me. Some people have had the same sponsor since the first day they came in and approached somebody. With regards to finding a sponsor, I had to swallow my pride, face my perception of embarrassment and simply ask for help. Some people stick around after the meeting; talk to the person that they think can help, develop a dialogue and then ask that person to be their sponsor. I just walked up to a person after a meeting and said 'Will you be my sponsor?" Both you and the person will have a better program because of it. Your future sponsor will explain why.
