# **RCM Report**

# Good morning

As this year is drawing to an end and it is time to pass the mantle, I would like to start the report by thanking the area and GSRs for this wonderful opportunity to serve. This has been a trying year for all, but NA has demonstrated its resilience and capacity for adaptation. I am proud of the fellowship and will continue on this journey of services in others areas. My best wishes to the new RCM, Nicole. I am sure she will be as wonderful at this new task as we've seen her before, and will represent the area well.

The off-month Regional meeting was held on ZOOM November 14, 2020. Nine (9) areas were presents.

The following were discussed during the meeting:

### 1) Areas Input requested

The Region is asking for the conscience of the areas regarding three topics. I would like if the chair agrees to ask for a vote for the first two and a discussion on the third:

- a) <u>Billboard Project</u>- Areas are split on how to move forward during the pandemic. Northwest area which is next on line for billboard requested that the project be held on until the pandemic is over, in order to make sure more people will see the display. Others areas were not so sure, mentioning that addicts the prime target for the billboards will be out and about regardless. Small Wonder ask for a straw poll in order to gauge the interest to hold on to the money for now. Seven (7) areas voted yes. The RCMs are asked to consult their areas.
- b) <u>Multi Zonal Service Symposium</u>- is scheduled for the end of May. The RD would like to attend and is asking the areas to start considering to see if it is possible to finance the costs (airfares, registration, hotel). Please remember MARLCNA is cancelled for next year.

- c) 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition- We are asked to see how groups can donate to areas in those times according to the 7<sup>th</sup> tradition. What are the ways?
- 2) Free State: Wayne- Not much to report. The Region has a Pro bono attorney (who is also in the fellowship) to help with the guidelines. There were over 35 entries for the convention theme. The theme is "The Spirit of Love". There is a new contest for Convention Logo. Winning price is a convention package including registration, all meals and paid events. However, Room will not be included.
- 3) Service Center: No Report
- 4) Region Chair: Tina- asked for everyone to put their contact info in chat box.
- 5) Vice Chair: Kellie- couldn't make it to Region this month. However, she sent a report. She re-organized the agenda making one for On Month and another for Off Month meetings. Is open to suggestions on those proposed agendas.
- 6) Secretary: Howard-. No Report

LAWSUIT, FINANCIAL UPDATE

NAWS is still in a week-to-week situation financially.

They were seeing what appeared to be initial increases in Fellowship literature purchases but then sales dipped the next month. So, it appears that we will have to continue our current approach of a week-to week financial assessment.

## Legal

They are pleased to announce that the petition to the Probate Division, of the Superior Court of Los Angeles, has been concluded. The original complaint against NA World Services, brought by a group of individuals calling themselves the "Autonomous Region," sought to remove NA World Services as Trustee of the Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust and impose surcharges on World Services. The filing of an objection by NA World Services has resulted in the court "sustaining," or upholding, that objection. That means the court agreed with our filed objection. For now, this matter is dispensed with.

The Autonomous Region of Narcotics Anonymous has filed a petition with the California Court to remove NAWS as Trustee of our Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust, (FIPT), for the following reasons: Petition – Remove Narcotics Anonymous World Service Inc as Trustee of our FIPT

WCNA We've had lots of questions about the 38th World Convention, scheduled for September 2021, in Melbourne Australia. We are not confident in what the world will look like in September 2021, as it relates to things like travel, visas, use of facilities, public health orders, etc. We have been in discussions with the city and convention center in Melbourne about travel and restrictions and possibilities for the future, and they have been very understanding. The most reasonable approach we have come up with is to try to reschedule the Convention for a date in 2022. The options that made this location possible could be extended to a new date, but only if we sign a revised agreement by the end of 2020.

Poll question Do you support moving the date of WCNA 38 into 2022, if possible? [Note: this would not affect the planning of future WCNAs.] Results: 84 (92%) yes -3 (3%) no -4 (4%) abstain -4 present not voting

PPP In the spring of 2020, when the pandemic hit and devastated the economy, several US government programs were quickly enacted including the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) and the Payroll Protection Program (PPP). Both programs offered low-interest loans to qualifying entities. The EIDL program included up to a \$10,000 grant as well as a long-term, low-interest loan with an amount that was capped at \$150,000 shortly after the program began. The PPP program offered a short-term, low interest loan, a portion of which could be reduced, subject to meeting certain criteria.

As they have previously reported, the World Board approved receiving \$150,000 from the EIDL program and \$676,740 from the PPP program. They also were offered a \$10,000 grant from the EIDL program that we did not accept. In Narcotics Anonymous our Seventh Tradition principle is clear that they decline all outside contributions. Based on our philosophy, we did not accept the \$10,000 grant, as they believed it could constitute accepting an outside contribution.

All CP web meetings are Saturdays at 11am Pacific Time.

2021 dates are still to be determined for February, April, June, August, October, and December and the rest of the Conference cycle. We are looking at alternating between the 2nd and 3rd Saturday of the month.

NA World Services Virtual Meetings Webinar Report Virtual Meetings and Carrying the Message effectively and virtually was recently approved as a primary focus for the Local Service Toolbox Project this Conference cycle. This project will continue through at least 2021, and we invite all members to help shape this important work for the Fellowship. Our first survey is online now at www.na.org/toolbox until 31 December 2020. You can find additional information posted about the project at that location. Please check back regularly.

This first Virtual Meetings webinar of this cycle was held 31 October 2020 to inform members about the work of the project, encourage members to participate in the first survey recently posted on www.na.org/toolbox, and provide the opportunity for members involved in virtual meetings and service efforts around the world to share their experience. At least 630 people attended the webinar for at least 30 minutes, with many more people attending for less time. Translation services were provided in Spanish, Portuguese, and Russian. Italian translation was available as a separate Zoom connection. Because of the expected size of the webinar, the platform was set up so that all attendees' microphones and the chat function were disabled. Attendees were invited to ask questions by typing them into a Q&A box. The webinar was also live-streamed on YouTube.

## **BASC Public Relations Subcommittee Report**

### December 5, 2020

The Public Relations Subcommittee met on Saturday, November 28, 2020 from 10:00 to 11:00 am via the virtual meeting app (Zoom). The Subcommittee meeting opened with the "We" version of the Serenity Prayer.

- 1. <u>Bus- Transit Signage</u>. Resumed discussion of posting public relations information (NA signage) on MTA buses, in conjunction with the NEFA, including BASC GSRs suggestion of signage at bus stop shelters.
  - a. On 50 buses at \$10 each carried for 4 weeks on each bus, plus production cost, for a total cost of \$1,175. Splitting the cost with NEFA would mean the Baltimore Area's share would be \$587.50. (50/50 = BASC \$293.75 / Home Groups \$293.75)
  - b. On 2 bus stop shelters at \$450 each for 4 weeks, plus production cost, for a total of \$1,275. Splitting the cost with NEFA would mean Baltimore Area's share would be \$637.50. (50/50 = BASC \$318.75 / Home Groups \$318.75)
  - c. PR recommends a March 2021 launch date.
  - 2. **PR Flyer**: See attached flyer.
- 3. Reopening In-Person Meetings. Guideline- information- provided by PR in October was distributed by the Area Chair to Area GSRs, via email. We noted (based on personal experience and observations) that some of the in-person meetings aren't following the guidelines and may need a PR response.
- 4. <u>Dental School PR Event</u>. To date, we still don't have information about whether the University of Maryland Dental School will host NA for its usual Fall recovery information event.

The Subcommittee closed with the "We" version of the Serenity Prayer.
