RCM Report

Good morning

The on-month Regional meeting was held on ZOOM June 13, 2020 with 8 Area presents.

The following were discussed during the meeting:

1) **Nominations:** will start to be taken at this month regional meeting. All positions should be voted on. Voting will be held at the August On-Month Regional meeting. The secretary announced she will not be repeating her position. However, she is willing to train somebody.

The Requirements for some positions are on top of one year Regional experience.

- a) Secretary: 2 years clean time
- b) Alternate secretary: 1 year clean time
- c) Treasurer: 5 years clean time
- d) Alternate treasurer: 4 years clean time.
- 2) **Updated:** Free State policy modifications for 2017-2019 will be added and organized to policy binder. A copy will stay at the Service Center.
- 3) RD & RDA Reports:
- a) The World Service Conference (WSC) part 1
- b) WSC part 2 will be held in August. A poll was made to choose which week-end.
- c) RD requested to extend her position until end of WSC 2020. Nomination and election will still be held, but position will not start until WSC is completed
- **d)** Reopening suggestions for the World have been discussed. Tentative dates are around September-October

- e) A Zonal meeting was scheduled for June 27. C&P Region will host next one on July 26 starting on 10:00 AM.
- f) A Survey is being done at PR for the World to explore the response of the fellowship to the pandemic. Those who are interested to participate can go to: www.na.org/survey
- g) The RDA also presented his report which also contains details for WSC part 3
- 4) **Policy Facilitator:** has made digital copies of the policies and the binder for hard copies at the service center.
- 5) Frees Sate Regional Convention: Two ad hoc committees were created:
 - a) One with the goals to rewrite and update policies in order to root out nepotism, improve financial management and better enforce financial accountability.
 - b) The second was an ad hoc committee for fund raising.
 - c) Others projects the convention committee is working on is to establish term limits of five (5) years for board members. Recent members will need to stay out for at least out for at least one convention cycle, which is two (2) years. This is to increase accountability and address problems of people staying in position past their time. In others news, the committee is also looking for convention sites which will better serve the needs of NA members, and also is exploring ways to decrease the price of registration for future conventions. They are also looking at decreasing the costs of room at the hotels for participants and board members.
 - d) They is also an audit being done. \$23,000 was in a No interest account. This money has been oved to Merrill Lynch. The prudent reserve of \$15,000 has been moved to a 2-year CD account. This will generate additional revenues for the convention

There are currently 15 board embers. Franck D has been designated the Resident Agent for the legal address of the convention which is the service center. This is done for tax purposes and to fulfill governmental regulations.

The convention committee also reaffirms his goal of a better representation to include <u>all areas</u> and to better include all demographics. Currently the composition of the committee is 8 men, 7 women; 11 Caucasians members and 4 Non-Caucasians.

6) Free State Service Center Board: Still not accepting walking orders, but it can be done on-line at the web-site. Allows a couple of days for deliveries. Donations are still accepted on-line to help the Service Center fulfills its obligations. Donation can be made at Cash App: \$FRSCNA or to Venmo: @Franck-Dyson. Both apps are linked directly to service center accounts.

- **7) Treasurer Report:** Donations can be made to Free State Region, via free state.org or through Pay Pal @FreeStateRegion.
 - We have two months operating expenses available along will all earmarked items. There is a left-over of \$1,107.01.
- 8) **Webservant:** keeping the ZOOM meeting list updated. There is a link for live meetings as well. There is a new tab at the Web site for new literature
- 9) **PR**: Chair put an event last month which was well attended. Did inform the assembly communications are being held with Clear Channel to resume the Billboards project.
- 10) **Phone line:** Incoming calls. 104 received (down from 107). Calls are down since COVID 19. Positions are needed to be filled, mostly over-night shifts.

- a) Baltimore area invited Circle of Sisters represented to a brief talk, informing and inviting female members of the region to participate at the incoming convention at Baltimore, Help is also needed. All vice chair positions and committees members are available.
 There is also a Face Book page.
- b) Bay area has a donation, but need to send it to treasurer.
- c) North East Freedom: 2021 area convention has been pushed to 2022.
- d) Small Wonder: Area convention has been rescheduled. New details will be forthcoming.






